• Increase the amount of information you can see on your screen: by clicking on the cross at the top right corner and hiding the Getting Started panels.



• Don't waste time moving between pages when viewing transaction lists, you can expand the number of transactions shown on one page by scrolling to the bottom of the screen and change the number shown from 25 to 200 per page.

• Get the most out of your Dashboard - this is the first screen you will see when you log into Xero so make it work for you. You can rearrange the order of the tiles so the most important information is shown at the top of the screen and you can also add accounts to the Account watchlist - allowing you to keep an eye on your expenses. For more information on this, see our March 2017 issue.



Remember to use the 'Wide view' option. When viewing some reports, especially the VAT audit report, you might
have to scroll across the screen to see all the information. In the top right corner of the screen click Wide View to
see a larger proportion of the report.



- A top tip that we have mentioned a few times now remember to use multiple tabs when looking into transactions. Right click on a link and chose 'Open in new tab' will allow you to easily follow transactions without having to re-load every page.
- If you are looking for a particular amount or description in a large report, remember to use the Ctrl+f function, this will bring a search bar in the top right corner of the screen to search for anything on the page.

• Xero has added its own shortcut in for your use. The + icon on the toolbar will quickly allow you to open a new invoice, bill, quote and many more tools.
